Terms & Definitions

Students with Disabilities (SWD): Students identified through a formal evaluation that determines eligibility for Special Education support services. All students have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) developed to support identified academic goals.

Free Reduced Lunch (FRL): 100% of American Samoa 's students are eligible for free breakfast and lunch due to the high percentage of economically disadvantaged families reported in the 2000 American Samoa Census.

Other: Ethnic groups aside from Asian/Pacific Islander and Samoaan
